

# NOTICE OF RACE

## The Energy Regatta 2008 Massachusetts Institute of Technology

September 27-28, 2008

### 1. RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in [The Racing Rules of Sailing](#).

1.2 The prescriptions of the US national authority will apply.

1.3 The class rules of the intercollegiate dinghy class as described in [The Procedural Rules for Intercollegiate Sailing Competition Fall 2005Spring 2008](#) will apply.

### 2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

2.1 The regatta is open to all participants who submit a completed entry form on the website of the race : <http://total-sailing.mit.edu>

2.2 All competitors must be MIT affiliates.

### 3. FEES

Participation to the regatta is free of charge.

### 4. SCHEDULE

#### Saturday September 27, 2008

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8:00 to 9:00	Breakfast, check-in and boats assignments
9:00	Race starts
12:00	Lunch break (food provided)
13:00 to 17:30	Race continues
18:00 to 19:30	Dinner reception at the sailing pavilion (music, food and fun!) immediately after the race.

#### Sunday September 28, 2008

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8:00 to 9:00	Breakfast, check-in and boats assignments
9:00 to 13:00	Race continues. Lunch provided.
13:00	Race concludes followed by Energy Regatta Trophy presentation.

## 5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available at the MIT Sailing Pavilion the day of the event.

## 6. VENUE

Racing will be conducted from the MIT Sailing Pavilion on the Charles River lower basin. Parking is available on Memorial Drive westbound, the lower end of Ames Street or the Hayward Street MIT parking lot. Bring a bailing bucket, tell tales, water bottle, sun screen and a good attitude.

## 7. SCORING and FORMAT

- Scoring will be the Low Point System by team, with no discard races. Byes may be implemented if we are oversubscribed.
- The Energy Regatta will be the sum of all races sailed on both Saturday and Sunday. The Energy Regatta Winning Team will be declared at the conclusion of Sunday's racing.
- All races will be sailed using the MIT Sailing Pavilion fleet of Tech Dinghies.

## 8. SAFETY

All competitors shall wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved PFD at all times while on the water. There are plenty available at the pavilion.

## 9. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
